On Thursday, November 5th, the 3rd, 4th and 5th





CORNERSTONE CORNER FOR GRADES 1-4

Our third Cornerstone book this year, **Say Something** by Peggy Moss, is a powerful story in which the narrator sees and hears teasing, put-downs, pushing, and other forms of bully (or bucket dipping) behaviors at her school. Because she's confused about what to do, **she doesn't do anything** at first. However, her responses change as she gains understanding and *empathy*.


Goals of lesson:

- 1. To understand the role of *UPstanders*.
 - *UPstanders* stand up to bully behaviors and advocate for targets.
 - UPstanders know and practice tools that support peers in face-to-face situations as well as online in the digital world.
- 2. To move all students from the passive role of *bystander* to the integrity-rich role of *UPstander*.

We hope you will talk with your child/children about being an *UPstander*. To reinforce the message at home:


- Talk about ways that each family member is an *UPstander* at home and in the community.
- Role-play different scenarios to practice *UPstander* behaviors, words you can say, and actions to take if someone needs your help.
- Say or do something when someone needs help.

You can also ask your kids to think about the statement,"Your Silence is Your Agreement", and ask what that means to them.



And remember, when you "catch" kids modeling positive behaviors... Notice, Name it, and Celebrate it!

Science Lab Notes

MULCHING MANIACS

Mr. Keedy and Ms. Deckert give our sincere thanks for the hard working crew of volunteers who braved the threat of rain at our November outdoor workday. We accomplished the primary goal of adding wood chip mulch to the pathways around the new garden

beds. Mulch serves as a barrier against weeds, retains moisture in the soil, and keeps the pathways from becoming muddy and slippery when our kids come out to garden. Lieke planted some new California Wild Lilacs (Ceanothus spp.) grown from seed by Mr. Keedy. We also removed an abundance of fallen leaves and non-native weeds in the riparian zone and grasslands to prepare those areas for our annual wildflower seeding. With rain finally returning, the outdoor classroom is already coming to life with new sprouts of arroyo lupine, Chinese houses, and meadowfoam, which reseeded from last year's spring bloom. What an amazing gift nature's cycles of renewal are. Hacienda thanks our November outdoor workday volunteers...

HACIENDA ANIMAL LOVERS ABOUND



COMPOSITION OF THE MONTH

In December we are listening to "Pachelbel's Canon" (also known as "Canon in D")

- Pachelbel's Canon is the name commonly given to a canon by the German Baroque composer Johann Pachelbel
- Sometimes it is referred to as Canon and Gigue in D or simply Canon in D.
- Neither the date nor the circumstances of its composition are known, and the oldest surviving manuscript copy of the piece dates from the 19th century.
- Hacienda students sing a version of
 - this son every year for the holiday sing-along
- Pachelbel's Canon, like Pachelbel's other works, remained in obscurity for centuries.
- A 1968 arrangement and recording of it by the Jean-François Paillard chamber orchestra became unexpectedly popular.
- Since the 1980s, it has also been used frequently in weddings and other ceremonies in the Western world.

FIRST AND SECOND GRADE WINTER/ HOLIDAY CHORUSES

First and second grade classes have worked very hard preparing for their Holiday Chorus performances on Friday, Dec. 11. First graders will perform for parents and families at 9:15 A.M. on Dec. 11th, and second

graders will perform for their parents and families at 2:15 P.M. on Dec. 11th. Mrs. Thompson has given students lyric sheets to practice at home. Both shows will take place in the school cafeteria. A recording of each performance will be sold for \$5/DVD, and proceeds will go back to the Hacienda music program. DVD order forms have been sent home and will also be available on the day of the performance.

On the day of their performance, first and second grade students will <u>not</u> be required to wear school uniforms. They are encouraged to wear their best holiday clothing for the performance. Students should <u>not</u> wear hats, though, as they can obstruct the view of other students.
