MESSAGE FROM MRS. LOY

Dear Hacienda families.

Nearing the end of January means that many people are working hard to keep those New Year's resolutions. With February (and Valentine's Day) fast approaching, those resolutions around healthy choices can sometimes be a challenge.

Our district Health and Wellness policy states that classrooms are limited to having one celebration with a sweet treat per month. Although some teachers have changed their policy to celebrating with no food items in their classrooms, others are following the guidelines set forth by our district policy.

In an effort to provide for the safety of our students, I would ask that parents be mindful of food allergies (in particular, we have many students with nut allergies). Please avoid bringing any treat to school that contains nuts. You may have noticed that our cafeteria no longer serves PB&J sandwiches. Instead, we have made the switch to sunflower butter as an alternative, because of the dangers of peanut allergies. Young children may not recognize some treats as having nuts, and make the choice to partake of something that could, in fact, be life threatening. Examples of this include Reese's Pieces, Snickers, certain ice creams, etc.

You should always check with your child's teacher to see if there are specific food allergies before bringing a treat to class. Always err on the side of safety, and do not bring treats to school that have nuts. With Valentine's Day right around the corner, please be mindful of this important information as you are making choices that may affect students' health.

Thank you for helping students to celebrate in class in a way that is safe and healthy.

- Lunchtime snacks are provided. If you would like to donate fruit, contact Allison Pruitt: apruitt@ sjusd.org


MARCH 12TH: MINI-OUTDOOR WORKDAY

COMPOSITION OF THE MONTH

In February we are listening to "Take the A Train" composed by Billy Strayhorn and performed by Duke Ellington and His Orchestra.

- Billy Strayhorn was introduced to Duke Ellington in 1938. Ellington was extremely impressed by him and they worked closely together for the next three decades. In his autobiography, Ellington wrote that "Billy Strayhorn was my right arm, my left arm, and the eyes in the back of my head".
- "Take the 'A' Train" was recorded by Duke Ellington and His Orchestra in February 1941, was a hit on the pop charts, and became their signature tune. It remains one of the most recognizable swing-era jazz standards.
- The lyrics to this tune are subway directions to get to the Sugar Hill area of Harlem where Ellington lived.


ABC PROJECT CORNERSTONE Champion Year, Lesson 5

Through My Eyes by Ruby Bridges

What do you think of when you hear these words?

Have you ever been a victim?

- STEREOTYPING
- PREJUDICE
- RACISM
- HATE CRIMES
- BIGOTRY
- DISCRIMINATION



For our children, racial tensions and struggles to achieve civil rights may sound like ancient history. But, as you know, our collective struggle to overcome injustice of all kinds is ongoing.

The ABC Program chose the powerful, true story of Ruby Bridges, a six-year old black girl who on November 14, 1960 walked through a mob of screaming segregationists escorted by Federal Marshals into her new school in New Orleans, Louisiana. Following the 1954 Supreme Court case Brown vs. Board of Education, a federal court in New Orleans ordered two white public schools to integrate in 1960. The plan was to integrate only the first grade for that year – and only black kindergarten students had to pass a difficult test in order to attend the previously all white school. The test was designed so that no one would pass it. Despite others' efforts to keep black students out, Ruby Bridges was one of only five students to pass the test. The drama that unfolded on TV screens all over the nation that fall was powerful. Day after day, the children heard shouts of racial epitaphs from an angry crowd of white protesters at their school. In spite of it all, these children persevered.

The goal of this lesson is to:

- Promote discussion about the importance of tolerance and acceptance of differences.
- Learn how it feels to walk in someone else's shoes.
- Practice techniques to promote a sense of belonging in our school communities by relying on their personal power as UP-standers to include all students.
- Role model responsible ways to accept and tolerate differences

Unfortunately, intolerance and injustice continues today. We hope that by encouraging discussion of past intolerance and injustice, we can help guide our students

toward actions that will build a more caring, just, inclusive, tolerant and safe school community for all.

2) In the near future my husband and I will be doing some home remodeling. On the list of things to get done are all new interior doors, interior painting, a couple ceiling fans, and closet organizers. Most certainly we will be purchasing quite a lot from



Home Depot. The percentage rebate for schools is 4%. I'm guessing we'll be spending at least \$4,000 and Hacienda will earn \$160 of that! Isn't that awesome!!!

3) My children are softball and baseball players. The spring season is fast approaching. No doubt they've grown since last season which means new cleats, new pants, and possibly new gloves, helmets and bats. How can Hacienda benefit from these purchases? Sports Authority gift cards offer 8%, Big 5 Sporting Goods gift cards offer 8%, Amazon.com gift cards offer 3%, and many other athletic shoe stores all participate in the Scrip Gift Card Program.


degree in Architecture from Cal Poly in SLO, and spent one of those years living in Denmark. She then lived in Los Gatos and Santa Cruz for a number of years.
